San Quentin Guest Program. As part of its ministry for death row inmates at San Quentin, members of St. Paul's have been hosting the mother of one inmate who drives from Bakersfield every week to visit her son. This loving service has been a literal Godsend for Sue Merriman; the expenses otherwise associated with her weekly visitations would be prohibitive.

To continue providing this assistance for the near future, we are asking for volunteers who have space in their homes on Saturday night. Sue brings her own bedding and sees to her own meals.

This call for volunteers is prompted by the fact that two members who have been providing ongoing lodging for Sue for nearly two years have the need now to accommodate some of their own family members. One expects to resume her role as host when her own family's needs are addressed and the other member is able to continue hosting Sue once monthly.

Each of the involved members can attest to the outstanding qualities of Sue, who, when possible, attends the 8 a.m. service at St. Paul's. Her dedication as a mother is additional testament to the person she is, leaving Bakersfield, as she does, every Saturday at 3 a.m. to get to San Quentin in time for her 8 a.m. visit with her son, Justin, and returning Sunday for a second visit before driving back home.
