Three Books for Summer Reading from Christopher.

- 1. The Restoration Project. I recommend my book not just for self-promotion, but because in the book I do my best to present the core practices that are so essential to our shared life here at St. Paul's.
- 2. Toxic Charity by Robert Lupton is a book I've recommended several times. It helps us stay clear and healthy in the way we follow Jesus' teaching to serve the least.
- 3. Sticky Faith by Kara Powell and Chap Clark. This book is filled with practical and research based ideas for building lasting faith in our children. I recommend this book not just for parents but for all who want to do the best they can to hand down their Christian faith to the generations after them.
