CHRISTOPHER'S WEEKLY MESSAGE

Thank you to the dozen or so of you who came to hear the latest draft of the great story I'm trying to tell. As a reminder, this past Saturday I offered the second of the 'Strengthen Your Spiritual Core' Saturday workshops. I offered a forty-five minute performance of a story I have been slowly shaping, an imaginative way of helping people wrap their hearts and minds around where we are spiritually and where we may be going.

It was a joy to tell the story, but it was an even greater joy to get the creative feedback and questions afterwards in our long conversation in Duncan Hall. As I'd hoped, the story evoked a wide range of hopes, fears and questions. The feedback I received is going to make the story stronger and more compelling, I look forward to telling it again in January.

The third of the workshops is next Saturday, October 10th. I'll be offering a mini-retreat based on my book. I'll be walking people through four stages of spiritual maturity. These are laying a foundation, radical self-knowledge, stripping and Quietness with strength. It will be from 9am to noon in Duncan Hall and provide time for quiet reflection with time for questions and conversation at the end.
