This week we will send out nearly 1000 letters. Many of us are busy worker bees folding and stuffing an stamping to send important letters to two different groups.

Tomorrow, a one page letter will go to nearly all of you that concisely describes who we are and where we're going and the importance of your money to help us get there. Yes, it's our annual stewardship drive, where we ask how much we can expect from each member of St. Paul's so that we can create a responsible, balanced budget, which is what we've done every year for the past ten years.
