From the Rector

Dear Friends,

Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the spiritual season of Lent, is on February 26th. There will be services at 7:30am, noon and 6:30 pm, all of which will include the imposition of ashes with those sobering words, "remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return."

There are three ways you are encouraged to observe Lent this year with others at St. Paul's:

- 1. Come on Wednesday evenings at 7pm starting on Ash Wednesday (when it will probably start a bit later because of the service). On Wednesdays through April 8th I will be teaching a practice based on a daily prayer, "O God, send me this day to do the work you have given me to do, to love and serve you with gladness and singleness of heart."
- 2. Read the Gospel of John. Both the Wednesday at 10am and the Thursday at 6:15pm Bible Studies will be reading this book. Join us by doing a daily reading from this profound book.
- 3. Fast from dinner on Wednesdays and Fridays. Wednesdays and Fridays are traditional fast days. On those days, eat nothing after 2pm. (Or, if you are a family where food is essential for domestic peace, eat a light, non-meat dinner.)

Of course, observe Lent as you see fit. And if you would like to feel a sense of community as you prepare your soul to receive the glorious truth of the mighty acts by which we were saved, try one or more of these three practices this year.
