In this sixth and final volume of Cahill's acclaimed *Hinges of History* series, the author leads readers through an epoch of epic changes and innovation, one that the Western world would not again experience until the 20th century.

Europe's rediscovery of classical antiquity inspired the two great movements in the sixteenth century. Namely, the Renaissance (or "re-birth") in Italy and Northern Europe – and the radical, religious wakeup call of the Protestant Reformation, led by Martin Luther and others. Arguably, these two events comprised the most formative era in the last thousand years of western civilization.
