From the Rector

Dear Friends-

I return from vacation loaded with ideas, games and images I'm looking forward to sharing with you, all centering around this poorly understood notion of Christian Call. What I want to do is help make Christian Call a lively and life-giving part of your everyday life. We have three different ways this fall to learn more about Call together.

1. **The Work is Very Near You**. Starting Labor Day weekend I will be offering classes on Saturdays at 8:30am, Sundays at 11:30am and Tuesdays at 6:30pm. I will be offering some teaching, a few powerful words to remember, and some little games to play throughout your week such that "gladness and singleness of heart," by God's grace, becomes real for you.

2. **Spiritual Forum.** Every Sunday at 9am people gather at the conversation end of Duncan Hall to explore together. We are now reading the teachings of Evagrius, a wise Christian of the 4th Century who knew the Desert Fathers and Mothers and many of the greatest theologians of his day. He offers a series of short teachings on the art of spiritual discernment. How, in the flow of life, we can distinguish good thoughts and impulses from bad ones. Come and read aloud and then discuss this ancient art of sorting our thoughts.

3. New College of Christian Practice. New College starts Wednesday, September 11th at 7pm, and is every other week for three meetings. For my offering this year I will be teaching how to enact three restorative stories in our daily life. I have recovered an ancient narrative theology, taught by St. Iranaeus, and made it useful for us. These three stories are Eve desires while Mary beholds, Adam sulks while Mary sings, and Eve and Adam desire while Jesus pours out. Which of our ancestors' practices do you follow? Come to New College and let these stories lead you to fullness of life.

Downing Library Book of the Month by Tom Witt

In keeping with the theme and integrity of the Downing Library, our featured book of the month is William J. Bernstein's *Masters of the Word: How Media*

Shaped History from the Alphabet to the Internet.

As Donn well captured in his annotated bibliography:

"The current age of digital communications and migrations is more apt to think of nations as networks. No longer does the image of a nation as a bounded community imagined on a larger scale fit today's world where it is ever less clear what the boundaries of national territories enclose or exclude. National borders are porous, and relations once rooted in national territory – from family to livelihoods to political relationships – increasingly spanning borders, linking far-flung realities and fellow nationals to each other and to other people and institutions in complex sociopolitical relationships."

Job Opening

WANTED—Volunteers for Death Row Ministry available to correspond with a condemned inmate. No experience necessary. Work from your own home at hours of your choosing.

The job description is as easy as it gets ... and your involvement could make a world of difference to a death row inmate at San Quentin State Prison, some of whom have been incarcerated for decades without contact with family or anyone in the outside world, except for defense counsel.

There currently are 19 volunteers writing to inmates. Sixteen of them also make periodic visits to the prison. Twelve, including Pastor Christopher Martin, are members of St. Paul's Episcopal Church. The call for additional volunteers follows a dramatic rise in the number of inmates asking for pen pals and/or visitors. After more than 20 years in this ministry—the outreach began with two people from St. Paul's visiting one inmate—the program had expanded to 13 inmates by the beginning of 2019. Word-of-mouth among the inmates has resulted in recent months in a 46 per cent increase—from 13 to 19—in the number of inmates communicating with the volunteers. Besides St. Paul's, members of two other churches are active in Death Row Ministry: Grace Church of Marin and New Life in Novato. Efforts are under way to involve other churches, mindful of Jesus' call to Christians in Matthew (25:36) to visit the prisoner, that when one does this "for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me."
