- 1. This past Sunday our community meeting affirmed the hard work of the Vestry, and in particular of Pat and Larry, toward the creation of the **Hardin Courtyard**. At the Vestry meeting this coming Tuesday I assume we will be affirming the next steps of going to the city for permits and receiving bids.
