This collection is both vast and varied, covering a wide array of knowledge and genres from history and art, to global politics and international law. One of Donn's personal favorites is Phillip Bobbitt's book, *The Shield of Achilles*, a work esteemed by Henry Kissinger himself. ### **St. Paul's History Corner** By Joy Moss

As we begin the celebration of our 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary, let's take a look at **how St. Paul's got started**.

In the beginning a small congregation gathered in the schoolhouse in San Rafael. In 1866, Bishop W.W. Kip visited San Rafael and held services. Later when Bishop Kip came to consecrate St. Church, Paul's remembered, "Years ago I was accustomed to come to this place to hold services when this church was almost

entirely unknown...

It seemed almost hopeless

to expect the formation of a parish or the erection of an edifice of worship" But the congregation persisted and a vestry was chosen and they commenced searching for a rector.

The Rev. William H. Dyer was their choice. He was a thirty-four year old native of Vermont. He boarded in a hotel on Fourth St. He began holding services in the old adobe courthouse that had originally been built by Timothy Murphy as a home. Being the largest building in town, it was chosen to serve as the courthouse.

In May of 1868, Rev Dyer went to San Francisco to attend the Annual Convention of the Episcopal Diocese of California. There St. Paul's Church was was admitted in union with the convention on May 6, 1868. That is how St. Paul's Church began 150 years ago.
