CHRISTOPHER'S WEEKLY MESSAGE

WHY HOLY WEEK IS ESSENTIAL

For the 14th time, we will be walking through Holy Week together. Every year, I make a major push to try to get as many of us as possible to the 4 main services of Holy Week. Why?

For years, I have had a central image in my heart and mind. I imagine that every year, we circle together around the unfathomable mystery of God. Each Christian season and event gives us a slightly different perspective on the mystery of God. What we see in Advent is different than what we see in Christmas, is different than what we see in Epiphany and so on.

It is as though we are traveling around a spiral which draws us, each year, if we are paying attention, just a little bit closer to the eternally still (and yet active) mystery of God.

The most important segment of the annual turning of the spiral, every year, is Holy Week. The events of Holy Week, all of them, are "the mighty acts by which we are saved." If we internalize the story of Holy Week, all else begins to fall into place for us.

I can't type an email long enough to help you know, at a deep level, what it is that we remember in the four services of Holy Week and why the memory of those particular events save us. No words can convey to our hearts and minds (and souls) what only actions, faithfully attended to, can begin to communicate.

This year, set aside time to go to all 4 services. Walk alongside Jesus and alongside many of us. Make it a priority and rearrange your schedule. (3/25 at 8am or 10am, 3/29 at 7:30pm, 3/30 at noon, 3/31 at 7:30pm.)

It used to be that culture would come to a pause so that these events could be observed by all. Those days are long gone. Now, we each need to make a very strong choice for God. You can do it. The first of the four services is next Sunday, the 25th, Palm Sunday. You can come to either the 8am or the 10am service.

The door is open.
