Thanks to our partnerships with Redeemer and Nativity we had over 120 people there, 5 baptisms and an extraordinary reception hosted by the DeManns. Christ is risen indeed!

The next big event in our common life is the **Open House** Chloe and I host twice a year at our home in San Anselmo. All are welcome and we particularly urge anyone new in the last few years to come. It is a week from this Sunday, on Open House and Pelican. People of all ages are invited. Our home is 7 minutes from the church, just above the United Market on Miracle Mile.

The following **Wednesday, the 18th**, I will be offering my one act play, **Pelican**.
