"Without writing, the literate mind would not and could not think as it does... More than any other single invention, writing has transformed human consciousness."

So writes Walter J. Ong, Jesuit priest, philosopher, cultural historian and author of our featured book for this month, *Orality and Literacy: The Technologizing of the Word.*

Ong's most widely known work probes the relationship between literature and the media, as well as that of psychology, education and sociological thought. It provides a fascinating insight into the social effects of oral, written, printed and electronic technologies and their impact on philosophical, theological, scientific and literary disciplines.

St. Paul's is rich in Stewardship with so many giving so much in time, talent and treasure. However, John McDermott, our treasurer, is raising a yellow flag. We've had some unexpected expenses like a \$5000 tax from the city, although generally our expenses are under control. But we need to keep up with cost of living increases for our outstanding staff and continue to do Outreach. And, over the past several years we have lost members of our Community leaving holes in our hearts and in our budget. These are the yellow flags that we need to pay attention to.

The Vestry has set a goal of Everyone Pledging and Achieving \$200,000 in Pledge Income by 2022.

It is important that we all understand the Challenge our Community faces and what each of us can do as we move through the stages of our life. We will be using the Annual Meeting and this Epistle to understand this Challenge. As we understand the Challenge, each of us should ponder these questions: Why is St. Paul's important to me? What is the right amount for me to Give?

In the months ahead, we'll be exploring Best Practices at other churches for ways to make financial Giving easier and better informed. We will redesign our Giving Campaign and new member orientation. We'll be seeking ideas from everyone for ways to enhance our Giving with Gladness and Singleness of Heart.
