A beautiful summary message from Pat Curtis, the convener and leader of Consecration Sunday:

The Results: Consecration Sunday

We are all Taking St. Paul's Forward into the Future

- 1. Culture Shift from Pledging motivated by Obligation to Participatory Giving motivated by Gratitude and Generosity
- 2. Record non-holiday attendance of 94 people on Consecration Sunday
- 3. 11 New Givers
- 4. 52 Giving Cards completed.
- 5. 37 Giving Units (37/52=71%) increased their projected giving over 2019
- 6. \$164,000 Estimated Giving on cards received
- 7. \$41,300 projected we'll receive from 25 regular givers who were unable to participate
- 8. Projected Total for 2020 **\$205,300** (2019: 77 pledging units \$175,000). 17% increase (\$205,300-\$175,000=\$30,300/\$175,000=17%)
- 9. We all had a good time and we did this together!
