Dear Friends-

This month we are taking an exciting and decisive step together in our shared Christian Pilgrimage. Consecration Sunday invites all of us into a different relationship with our money. One of the profound pleasures for me over the last few months has been to witness so many of our leaders begin to talk about their relationship with money in a different way as we have prepared for Consecration Sunday. I see people becoming free and grateful.

Consecration Sunday is intimately connected to our collective response to last year's RenewalWorks survey. In response to the data 84 of us gave to the church about where we are in our spirit life, the RenewalWorks team set out a series of three Landmarks, each of which had three Signposts. Under the first Landmark, "Becoming spiritual leaders of our own faith," one of the three Signposts is "Share our gifts and money with gladness and singleness of heart."

Sharing "with gladness and singleness of heart" isn't something you accomplish once and then you're done. Rather, it is entering into a lifelong practice.
