## **Downing Library Book of the Month** by Tom Witt

Over the years, at one point or another, most of us have heard Christopher pay kindest homage to one of his spiritual mentors, the late, great Rev. Gordon Cosby.

The respect is understandable. Cosby blessed the lives of many.

During World War II, Cosby served as a chaplain and first lieutenant in the 101<sup>st</sup> Airborne Division. He was part of the D-Day invasion of Normandy. He helped pull wounded soldiers to safety. He ministered to the dying. He buried hundreds of brave, fighting men, including his best friend. For his valor, he was awarded a Silver Star Medal.

In 1947, the Virginia native co-founded Church of the Saviour, an ecumenical congregation in Washington D.C. – one of the first interracial churches in the then-segregated nation's capital. Rev. Cosby spent his life advocating for social justice. But arguably, his greatest legacy was to call believers into a deeper commitment of faith, to become mature Christians actively involved in shared ministry to the poor, the homeless, the disenfranchised. He formed a constellation of over 40 mission groups, many of which are still active to this day. He preached on the vital importance of small discipleship groups and what he identified as six requirements for a thriving church. And in time, his life's work helped spawn or inspire various contemporary movements, including the Missional Church, the Emergent Church and Christopher's own Restoration Project, based on *The Rule of St. Benedict*. This month, the Downing Library is pleased to spotlight Gordon Cosby's compendium of inspiring sermons, *By Grace Transformed: Christianity for a New Millennium*. It is a visionary read.

and serious injuries to his right hand last December when his motorcycle was struck by a car near his home in Miami, Fla. He was hospitalized for two months and not cleared for weight-bearing on his feet until mid-March, a month after being discharged from the hospital.

Early in May Kevin and Ana walked a 5K course in Miami and were celebrated at the finish by family members and friends.

Kevin thanked Father Christopher and Nancy Skinner, keeper of the prayer list, specifically. "I feel like I'm here walking because of the support from all of you," he told the church. The accident and following weeks were a "real test," Kevin said, "but it means so much to me that all of you were there with me."
