Collect of the Day

The First Lesson Isaiah 52:13 - 53:12 *Seated.*

After the reading, all reply: Thanks be to God.

Psalm 22 *Sung by cantor*

REFRAIN



My God, my God, why have you for-sak-en me?

Second Lesson Hebrews 10:16-25 *Seated.*

After the reading, all reply: Thanks be to God.

Hymn 172

The Passion Gospel John 19:1-37 *Seated*

At the verse which mentions the arrival at Golgotha, all stand.

Sermon The Reverend Christopher H. Martin *Seated*

A moment of silence, then standing, if able.

The Solemn Collects *Book of Common Prayer, page 277*

At the end of each Collect, the people reply Amen.

Hymn 168

The cross is brought in and lowered to the ground. People may come up and hammer their nail into the cross.

THE BRINGING IN OF THE CROSS

Once the cross is in place, a minister proclaims.

Behold the wood of the Cross,
People **on which was hung our salvation.**
