The people gather in the courtyard. Fire is kindled in the baptismal font.

Opening Prayers

Minister The Light of Christ Sung three times

People Thanks be to God. Sung three times to the same tune.

After the Paschal Candle is processed to the door, the people follow the clergy and acolytes into the church in silence.

The Exsultet Sung by a minister, remain standing

Minister Rejoice now, heavenly hosts...

...in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen

Minister The Lord be with you (S120)

People And also with you.

Minister Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People It is right to give God thanks and praise.

Minister It is truly right and good...

...who gives light to all creation, and who lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen.

RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL VOWS

The minister says an opening prayer.

Minister Do you reaffirm your renunciation of evil and renew your commitment to Jesus

Christ? People I do.

Minister Do you believe in God the Father?

People I believe in God, the Father, Creator of heaven and earth.

Minister Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Minister Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

People I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Minister Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of the bread, and in the prayers?

People I will, with God's help.

Minister Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord? People I will, with God's help.

Minister Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

People I will, with God's help.

Minister Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as

yourself? People I will, with God's help.

Minister Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being? People I will, with God's help.

The minister processes through the congregation, sprinkling the waters of baptism.

There is a loud knocking on the door, after which:

People We have come seeking Jesus of Nazareth. What have you done with his body?

Minister He is not here- Alleluia, Christ is risen!

People The Lord is risen indeed! Alleluia!

The lights come up.

After the Holy Gospel, all reply: Praise to you, Lord Christ.

For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen

At the Breaking of the Bread (S-154) Celebrant Alleluia Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us; People Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia.

All haptized Christians are welcome to receive communion. Whoever you are, wherever you are in your journey of faith, you are welcome to receive initiation into the church through the sacrament of baptism.
